■ 159 Shirehampton Road, BS9 2EE


Also back garden via side tunnel.

Originally a red brick front – it's mostly a place to park the car but we thought it might as well be as pretty as it can be, and now the Wistera and Photinia are taking over.




Coombe Dingle trail...

- 6 Wyedale Avenue, BS9 2QQ
 Rather wild, but hopefully friendly for the insects
- Backwoods, 5 Southside Close, BS9 2QY
 An explosion of colour!
- 40 Southwood Drive, BS9 2QU
 A front garden that is secluded and private yet inviting and welcoming all at the same time.
- 2 Bowden Close, BS9 2RW
 A mixture of ornamental trees, lawn, herbaceous perennials and pots planted within a cottage style planting theme.
- 21 Grove Avenue, BS9 2RP

 A garden in its adolescence: hardstanding contrasted by soft planting with the biggest bug wall you'll ever see and Art-Deco-inspired fencing.
- 25 Grove Avenue, BS9 2RP
 Different, not weed-free, but hopefully full of colour.
- 2 Pitchcombe Gardens, BS9 2RH An overgrown cottage garden!
- 4 Pitchcombe Gardens, BS9 2RH
 A garden make-over planted eagerly but perhaps randomly beds replacing scrawny grass and concrete; star plants the mulberry and a rose whose leaves are scented in the rain.
- 5 Pitchcombe Gardens, BS9 2RH
 A small, colourful garden planted for pollinators.
