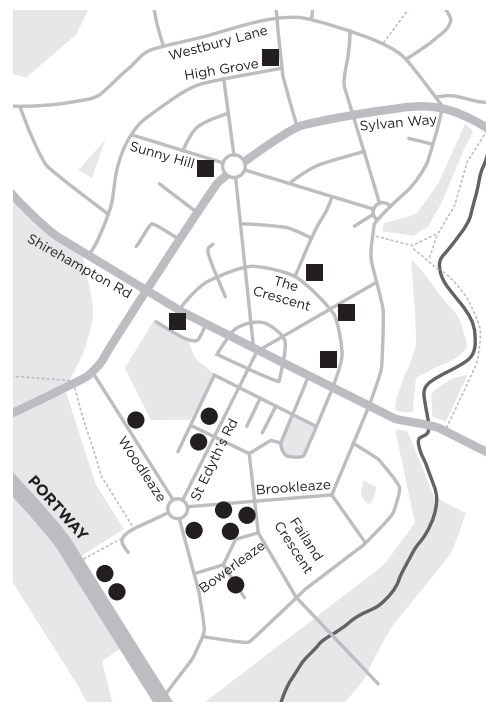

Sea Mills South

- **15 St Edyths Rd, BS9 2EP**
The garden is planted with roses, a tree peony and perennials. Also two raised beds for fruit and veg.
- **11 St Edyths Road, BS9 2EP**
Let's add a little colour...
- **20 Woodleaze, BS9 2HY**
Trying to make edible look (and taste) incredible.
- **14 The Pentagon, BS9 2ER**
Secluded, colourful English cottage garden filled with plants to attract bees and butterflies!
- **17 Bowerleaze, BS9 2HJ**
A garden to cheer us up – my dad started making our garden beautiful each year, now I carry on with it.
- **Opposite No. 1 Garden Close (off Bowerleaze), BS9 2HZ**
Grassy area with central wheelbarrow filled with an assortment of plants.
- **19 Failand Crescent, BS9 2HH**
Ongoing project. Wildflower lawn, bog pond, fruit trees, green roof, raised bed, willow screen.
- **8 Brookleaze, BS9 2ET**
Blooming cammassia, surrounded by New Zealand wind grass in raised beds.
- **136 Portway, BS9 2HT**
Weeping cherry tree. Borders full of colour. – we love our roses. Small border for spring flowers.
- **138 Portway, BS9 2HT**
Red, yellow and blue is the colour scheme of my front garden, with violas pansies and lilac all in bloom.

Sea Mills North

- **95 High Grove, BS9 2NR**
Display is on fence surrounded by hedge, greenery and flowers in front of house.
- **43 Sunny Hill, BS9 2NH**
Planted borders, containers and pots.
- **159 Shirehampton Road, BS9 2EE**
Hopefully a lot of colour to be seen, including two rockeries. Access to back garden via side tunnel.
- **38 The Crescent, BS9 2JS**
A garden full of many different flowers.
- **24 The Crescent, BS9 2JR**
Winding grass walkways through the shrubs and young trees. A bug hotel and sedum roof.
- **3 The Crescent, BS9 2JR**
Allotment/garden plot containing flowers and veg. Access via the lane between numbers 7 & 9.

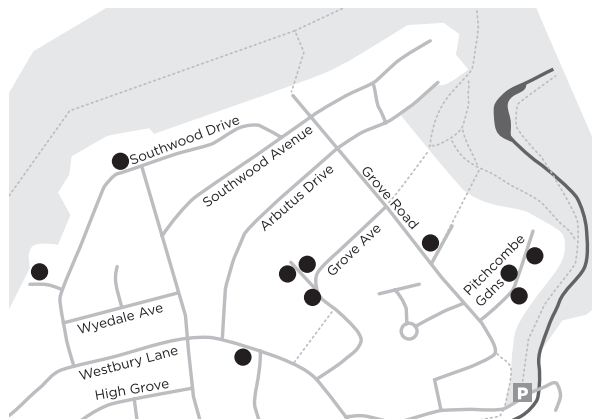

- **73 Southwood Drive, BS9 2QS**
Pretty and productive. The start of a mini-orchard, hawthorn hedge, roses and wisteria.
- **Backwoods, 5 Southside Close, BS9 2QY**
A splash of colour...
- **31 Westbury Lane, BS9 2PQ**
Once over-grown and neglected, the garden is becoming more established year on year. My haven.
- **21 Grove Avenue, BS9 2RP**
Look here hoping to find a Flaming June!
- **2 Bowden Close, BS9 2RW**
A garden full of herbaceous and container plants with a lawn and semi mature trees.
- **18 Bowden Close, BS9 2RW**
A semi-woodland garden with roses, shrubs, trees, and a small glade.
- **30 Grove Road, BS9 2RL**
Behind high Beech hedges – mostly lawn with cottage garden planting. Roses will hopefully be out...
- **23 Pitchcombe Gardens, BS9 2RH**
An informal garden existing on the edge of chaos. Ever changing as plants seem to move around at will.
- **2 Pitchcombe Gardens, BS9 2RH**
An overgrown cottage garden!
- **5 Pitchcombe Gardens, BS9 2RH**
Small jumble of a front garden, good for pollinators.
